Dunn Middle School

The Harnett County Board of Education spotlighted six 7th graders attending middle schools in the county who have all been recognized by the Duke University Talent Identification Program (TIP) as recipients on the state and grand level. Duke TIP is a nonprofit organization dedicated to serving academically-gifted and talented students. They work with the students, their families and educators to identify, recognize, challenge, engage and help students reach their highest potential.

The Seventh Grade Talent Search identifies bright 7th graders based on standardized test scores achieved while in middle school. Candidates are invited to take the ACT or SAT, which allows them greater insight into their academic abilities.

Two Dunn Middle School students were recognized for qualifying for state, Daughtry Williams and Grayson Bradham, pictured. Both scored at or above the national average of recent high school graduates on at least one part of either test; and have scored among the top 2% of the Talent Search pool; and scored 1,200 or higher on the SAT.
